

Pastor Brendan and the SPRC are currently working with Reverend Rob Townsend, Presiding Elder for the Northern Maryland District and the Dean of the Appointive Cabinet of the Northeast Annual Conference of the GMC, to begin the process of choosing a successor - viable candidates will be recruited for and presented to the SPRC for consideration, and each candidate selected to move forward will participate in a formal interview process with the SPRC. We're hopeful to select, and have an official offer acceptance from, our new pastor ahead of Pastor Brendan's departure in June.

Do members have a say in the hiring process?

Under the GMC, the SPRC is responsible for hiring for all roles within HCC, including the Lead Pastor position. All SPRC members are HCC members, nominated and selected for service by other HCC members.

That said, the SPRC welcomes and encourages your feedback to gain an understanding of perspectives regarding pastoral candidates' experience, character traits, attributes, etc. so that we can thoughtfully prepare our requirements for the GMC with your insight.

What will Pastor Brendan's transition look like?

Pastor Brendan will remain our Lead Pastor until June, and our ministries will continue to be spearheaded by current leadership. Because of Pastor Brendan's gracious time allowance and the energy and commitment our ministry leaders deliver to our congregation and community, we can look forward to a successful and seamless transition.

Will Pastor Brendan continue to preach, lead new member classes, officiate weddings / funerals, perform baptisms, etc. during the transition period? Yes.

Will Pastor Jesse continue to be our Pastor of Family Ministries? Yes.

Will there be an event planned to celebrate Pastor Brendan's contributions to HCC ahead of his departure?

Yes – we're excited to celebrate Pastor Brendan's unwavering discipleship and leadership over his past seven years of service at HCC, and we'll keep all members and the congregation posted on details closer to time. In the meantime, please shower Pastor Brendan, Meagan and the boys with your gratitude and well wishes.

How can I help support and ensure a smooth transition for my children / youth?

Be transparent with your children when this topic of discussion arises - share with them that Pastor Brendan felt a personal calling to move forward, and he courageously answered. To help them understand, consider sharing stories of biblical respondents to God's call (Abraham leaving his homeland for a new promise, Moses freeing Israel, David becoming king, Isaiah becoming a prophet, the apostles following Jesus, etc.)

Why did Pastor Brendan resign?

Following nearly seven years of leading our church, and after thoughtful discernment of God's plan for his next step in faith, Pastor Brendan felt a personal calling to move forward from HCC for a new opportunity to continue using his gifts for God's unique purpose and mission for his life.

When will Pastor Brendan's last day / sermon be?

Pastor Brendan is graciously committed to serving in his current role until June. This will benefit us tremendously, as it'll allow us the time needed to thoughtfully and prayerfully select a new pastor.

What new opportunity will Pastor Brendan be taking on?

Pastor Brendan will be serving another congregation in ministry – details will be shared later, after the Cabinet has prayerfully discerned.

Could the church's affiliation, mission or vision change as a result of new pastoral leadership?


Our church's affiliation will not change, and our new pastor will be selected by the SPRC and appointed by the GMC. Our mission and vision are regularly evaluated on a recurring basis (ex: this summer, Pastor Brendan lead a Vision Committee that finalized a three-year vision plan for HCC). Under our new pastor's leadership, we'll continue to monitor and optimize these core values.

What does the process of finding a new pastor entail?

While historically, prior to Pastor Brendan's initial arrival, our church under the UMC affiliation used an episcopal "appointment system" where bishops, not congregations, have the final authority to assign pastors, we'll be hiring for our new pastor under the GMC guidelines, which differ significantly and had been used after disaffiliation last year when we'd asked Pastor Brendan to continue his leadership of our church. A detailed overview of this process can be referenced below:

Feature	United Methodist Church (UMC)	Global Methodist Church (GMC)
Final authority	Bishop and cabinet have final say.	Local church has a significant voice and can decline a candidate.
Congregational power	Input is consultative; local SPRC does not hire the pastor.	Power is more congregational, with the ability for the church to interview and reject candidates.
Guaranteed appointment	Ordained elders are guaranteed an appointment.	No guaranteed appointment; clergy must compete for positions.
Appointment length	Appointments are made annually.	Appointments are intentionally longer-term.
Bishop's role	Elected for life, with full authority over appointments.	Term-limited, with less concentrated authority.

Cost Incurred to Date: \$34K






